Mrs. Betty "Hall" Weaver, 84, of Carthage, Missouri passed away on December 8, 2021. She was born July 20, 1937, in Avilla, Missouri and graduated from Carthage High School in 1955. She received a BS Degree from PSU, Pittsburg in 1959 and a Master's Degree from Drury College, Springfield in 1977.

She was united in marriage to Gary Weaver in 1956; he preceded her in death in 1975.

Betty was a retired teacher and coach. She taught high school in Kansas for two years, California for seven years and 23 years in Missouri including: Golden City, Cabool, Sarcoxie, Willard, and retiring from Jasper in 1997. She then worked three years for Jackson Hewitt Tax Service.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Carthage where she served as Treasurer of the Deacon's and Circle 1, an elder and trustee, and co-moderator of the Presbyterian Women. She had volunteered for Meals on Wheels, Crosslines, and Angel Food distribution.
