Dixie Jean Vacca, 77, of Carthage, Missouri, passed away peacefully on Monday, November 10, 2025, at home surrounded by her family. Born on November 23, 1947, in Carthage to T.J. and Wilma “Lucille” (Legore) Anderson, Dixie graduated from Carthage High School with the Class of 1965. She was the owner and operator of Rural Refuse Service. After selling the business she went to work for Steadley which was later acquired by Leggett & Platt. She worked there until her retirement in 2020. Dixie was a devoted member of Bethel United Methodist Church for four years. She passionately supported her community, serving on the board of the Powers Museum, volunteering with Compassionate Friends, and championing causes such as the Carthage Humane Society and Carthage Schools. Dixie had a generous heart and was always eager to help others. She was also known for her spirited presence online as a true “keyboard warrior” on Facebook.

On May 22, 1969, Dixie married the love of her life, Richard Vacca, in Miami, Oklahoma. They shared many wonderful years together until his passing on November 12, 2015.
