Edith M. Pugh, 101, passed away October 15, 2020 in Carthage, Missouri. Edith was born April 27, 1919 in Minden Mines, Missouri to Lincoln Gregg and Jessie Perkins Gregg. Edith was a lifetime area resident and was a School teacher, she taught school from 1936 to 1946 until her husband returned home from the war effort, she then returned to teaching in 1956 retiring in 1982 teaching for a total of 36 years with 22 of them in Jasper, Missouri. Edith was united in marriage to Lawrence Pugh April 22, 1942, he preceded her in death April 9, 1969.
