April 22, 1937 - January 20, 2021

Glenn Dubry, age 83, passed away peacefully on January 20, 2021 at Freeman Hospital in Joplin, MO from complications of COVID-19. Glenn was born April 22, 1937 in Carthage, MO and lived in the Carthage area his entire life. In January 1956, he married Donna, his wife of 65 years, and had three children, Pam, Renee and Randy.

Glenn joined the Carthage Fire Department in August 1965 where he enjoyed a long career and, after 34 years of service, retired as Battalion Chief in April 1999. After retiring from the fire department, he was a bus driver for the Carthage R9 School District for 12 years.

Glenn loved to travel. Some of his favorite memories were of the road trips he would take his family on for summer vacation. He especially loved “out west” as he would say. He and the family spent many hours in the mountains in Washington State and on the cliff-lined beaches along the Oregon Coast. Glenn was a member of the Nazarene Church for 50 years.
