Patricia Lee (Bridges) Turner, 96, passed away Wednesday, December 7, 2022. at St. Luke's Nursing Center in Carthage, Missouri. Patricia was born August 28, 1926, in Little Rock, Arkansas to Carl R. Bridges, Sr. and Nellie Grace (Spicer) Bridges. She moved to Carthage, Missouri with her parents when she was five years old and remained until her death. During high school Patricia was a member of the Olympians, National Honor Society, Band, and Orchestra. She graduated from Carthage High School in 1944. After high school, she was employed at Leggett & Platt as a secretary for George Beimdiek. Sr. and Harry M. Cornell, Sr. Patricia was then employed as a medical secretary for Dr. Richard R. While attending, she taught Sunday School for the Junior Department for several years. Patricia had several articles published in magazines.
