Robert Keith "Pistol" Baugh of Carthage, passed away November 21, 2018 at St. Luke's Nursing Home after a 10-1/2 year battle with brain cancer. Pistol was born in Carthage, MO on May 19, 1950 to Art and Irene "Wagner" Baugh, Sr.

Pistol married Marilyn O'Dell on November 17, 1973 in Carthage; she survives.
