Richard "Rick" Moffatt, 65, of Carthage passed away at his home Wednesday February 15, 2017. Rick was born March 27, 1951 in Lamar, Missouri. He was the son of Ronald Moffatt and Mary Brummett Moffatt. Rick moved to Carthage in 1978 from Independence, Missouri. He owned and operated Star Lanes in Carthage for 30 years. Rick was a member of the Center Creek Golf Course, Bowling Proprietors Association, and a proud supporter of the Arkansas Razorbacks.
