Virginia Lee “Fullerton” Dintaman passed away at 5:09 a.m., Tuesday, November 10, 2009. She was born on December 17, 1926 in Cave Springs, Missouri. Virginia was a graduate of Alba High School class of 1945. She married E.J. “Jack” Utter and moved to Kansas City, Missouri where they started Blue Ridge Construction Company, building custom homes. They had three daughters, Cheryl Utter Denney, Karen Utter Brooks, and Jan Utter Hudson. In 1968 they moved back to Carthage, Missouri and started another business, Utter’s Meat Processing.

Virginia survived E.J. Utter in 1970 when he died in a car/train accident. Many years later she was married to Byron Dintaman whom she survived in 2005. In October 2008 she moved from Carthage to Oklahoma City, to be near her daughters. She was enjoying making new friends at her new home in an Independent living residential community. She suffered a heart attack on October 28th. After spending eight days in the hospital she was released to start rehabilitation. She suffered another heart attack November 9th and was admitted to the Baptist Integris Medical Center.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Vollie & Willa Fullerton and two of her brothers, Don and Garold Fullerton.

She is survived by two brothers, Bud and Kaye Fullerton; her three daughters; two son-in-laws, Gerry Hudson and Ken Brooks and two grandchildren; Kelsey and Kaela Brooks. She is also survived by step-children; Caryl Dintaman Lombard, Betty Dintaman Clubb, and Dale Dintaman.
