William "Clyde" Phillips, Sr., 75 of Carthage passed away at 1:56 p.m. Friday, July 23, 2010 at his home. Clyde was born on August 9, 1934 in Rogersville, MO. He was the son of William Lincoln Phillips and Nettie "Hardy" Phillips. Clyde was a long time resident of Carthage. He worked for J.J.
